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Dr Andy H. Y. Ho is an award-winning researcher, educationist and psychologist who specializes in public health and mental health, psychosocial gerontology, hospice and palliative care, life and death education, holistic therapies and community empowerment. He is an elected member of the prestigious International Work Group on Death Dying and Bereavement, a Fellow in Thanatology, and a Marriage and Family Therapist. While serving as reviewer for numerous international academic journals as well as advisor for various non-profit social service organizations, he is also the Founder of LifeLAB Institute Singapore, the Founding Advisor of the International Love-Soar Children Grief Awareness Project, and the Founding Host of Death Café Hong Kong. With deep passion to empower the oppressed and the underprivileged, Andy has fundraised and obtained over S\$12 million from competitive grants and major charities over the past decade to develop a wide array of empirical, translational, and participatory action research projects that promote creative engagement and compassionate citizenry; particularly, in the areas of active aging, dignified end-of-life care, psychiatric rehabilitation, medical humanities, art and mindfulness practices. He has also produced numerous acclaimed public health campaigns and short film documentaries; authored over 60 books, chapters, research reports and articles in prominent journals such as *Age and Ageing*, *Comprehensive Psychiatry*, *Death Studies*, and *The Gerontologist*; as well as presented in over 100 keynote, invited, and conference presentations around the world. His social and scholarly contributions have been recognized with distinction by both local and international academic, professional and government bodies.
